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"The competition that trucks and airplanes are giving the railroads is merely part of the progress of our nation, and we are going to continue to progress," said an official of a western railroad in a public speech recently. "There is," he said, "a legitimate field for all divisions of the transportation industry, and it is our job to get along with one another."

Motor transport today is one of the greatest economic factors in the nation, being responsible, directly or indirectly, for one-seventh of all pay envelopes. Too, taxes on motorists make up one out of every nine dollars collected by local, state and federal governments.

Drivers of motor trucks and buses have earned, by a wide margin, the distinction of being the safest drivers on the highways. Since 1927, the year in which records first became available, fatal accidents involving private automobiles have increased by 21 per cent, while those for trucks have decreased by 29 per cent, and those for buses have decreased by 41 per cent. Had the drivers of private passenger cars made the same progress in safe driving as the drivers of trucks and buses, the total number of fatal street and highway accidents would have been reduced by now by approximately 33 1/3 per cent.

"This condition of interstate use of these highways is only in its infancy, so to speak. It has just begun. It is rapidly increasing and the time is not far distant when those great trunk highways will be used as regular lanes of long distance motor bus and truck transportation, running on regular schedules just as they now are run in and around the larger cities and towns."—Senator F. M. Simmons, February 4, 1925.

"Government policies should be freed of any purpose either to favor or to handicap any form of transportation with relation to any other form. We cannot solve the problem on the theory upon which horses are handicapped in a race."—National Transportation Committee.

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
