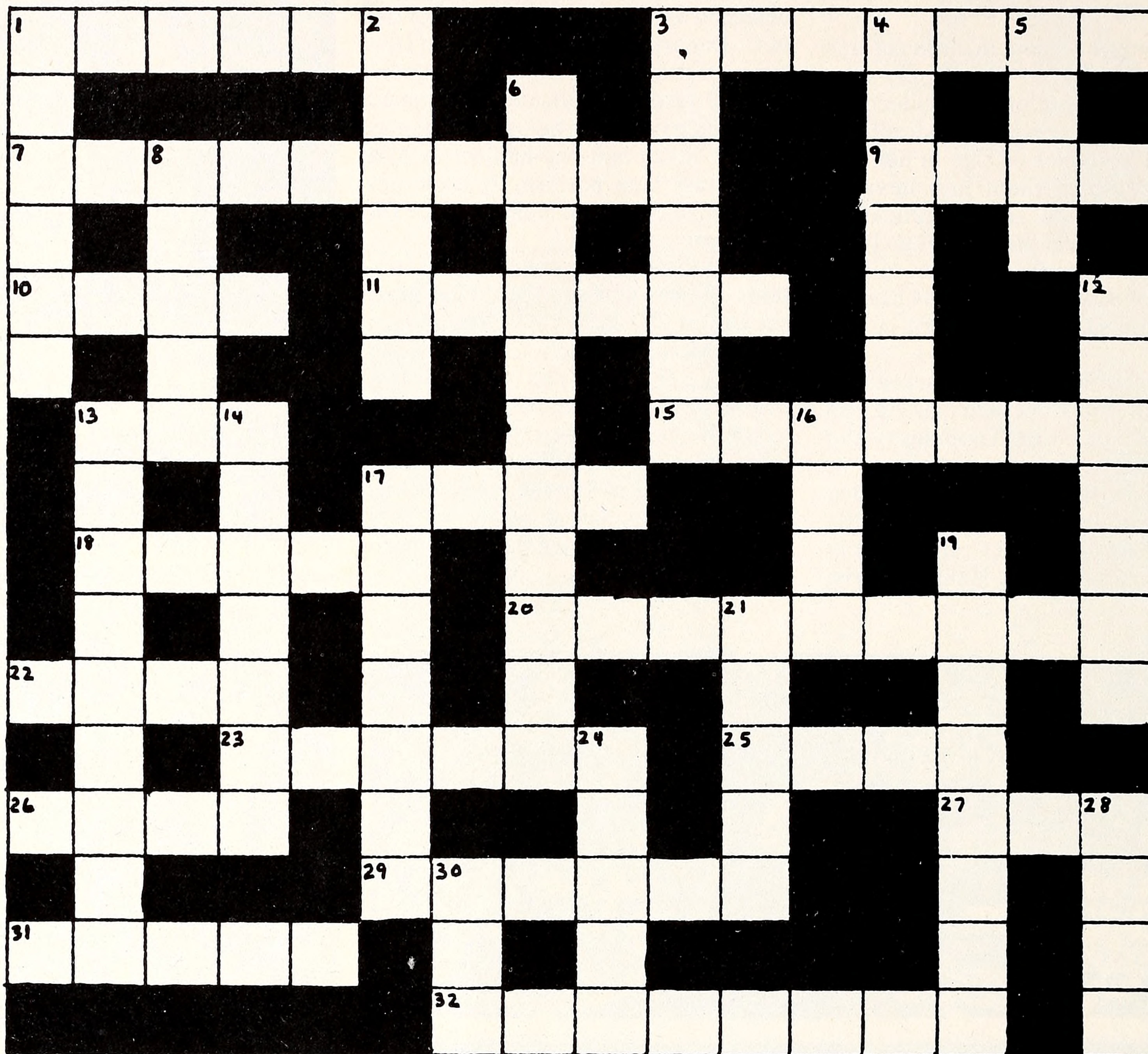


Tar Heel Crossword

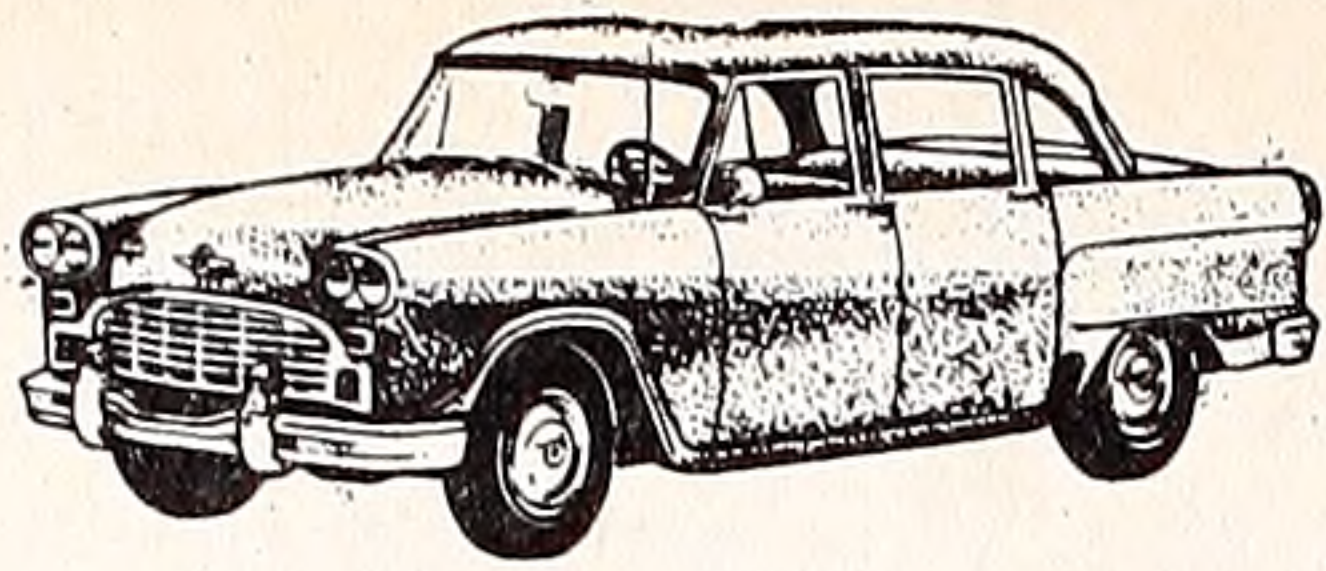

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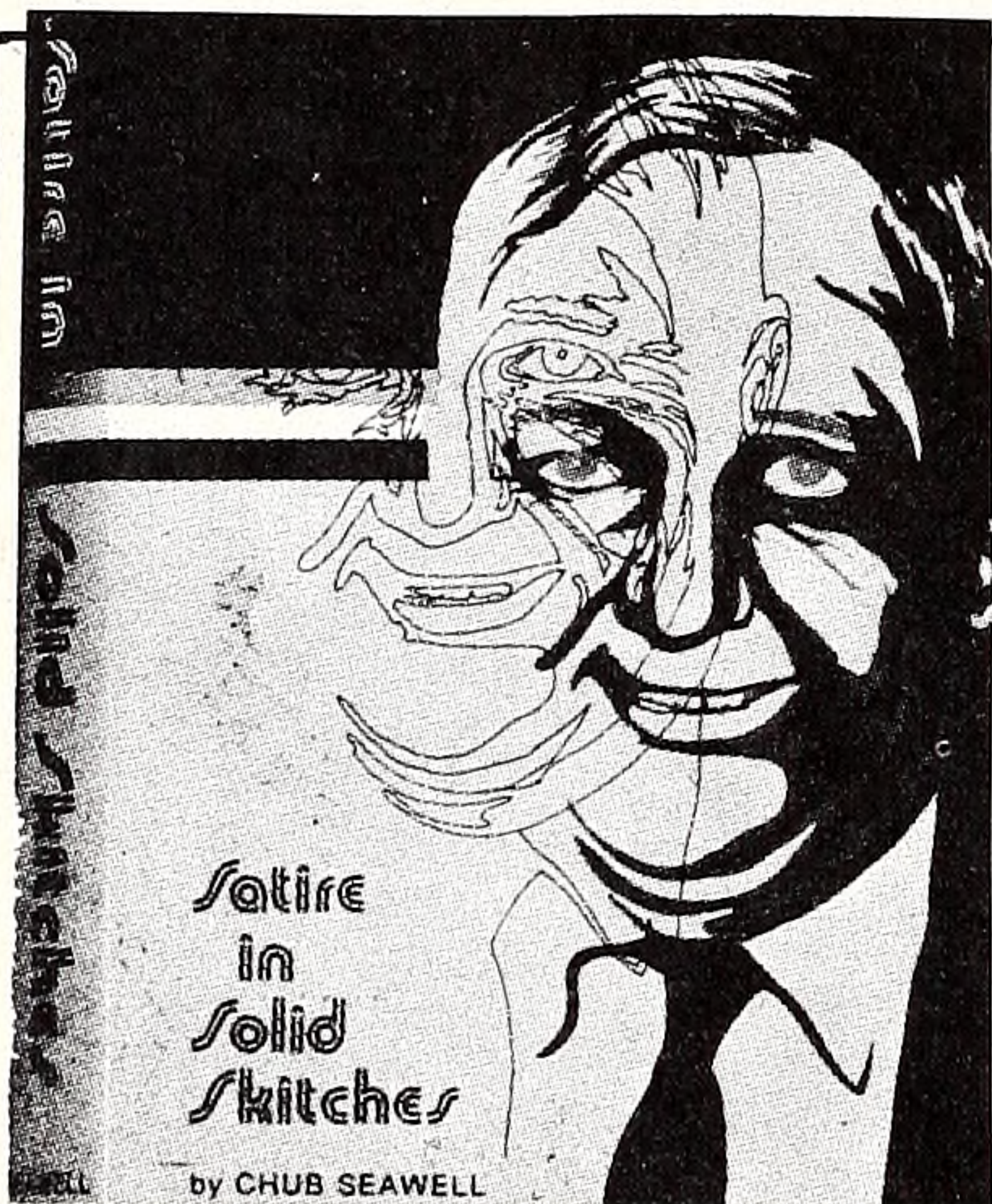

have written President Carter, "Loss of the Panama Canal would threaten our ability to survive."

In 1975, 45% of the ships passing through the canal were from the U.S. Alaskan oil will greatly increase this traffic very soon.

Since this is U.S. Property, to yield to threats is pure blackmail. Where are human rights respected in Panama?

The "price" of the property in 1902 was \$166,362,173 for the 647 square miles of Canal Zone Jungle. We pay Panama 2.3 million annually and now they "forbid" us to build another sea-level canal! We "rent" nothing from Panama and never have. The above "payment" represents the loss of railroad traffic to the canal.

About 70% of canal traffic originates or terminates in the U.S. Once this

vital link of our defense falls into unfriendly hands you can imagine the results.

When I was there, the Panamanians demanded gold and silver payments. (They had no confidence in federal reserve notes). So, figure how much more they benefitted by being "aliens!" They who are employed in service of the canal receive civil service retirement benefits. Panamanians have the highest standard of living in Central America and the fourth highest in Latin America. — E. B. DRURY, Thomasville, N.C. 27360

Another Manual

Having already written a manual for beginners in the field of bobbin lace making, she is currently working on a second manual; this one to be on needle lace.

Both books are very detailed with photographs and diagrams, the photographs being the work of her tree-farmer husband, who also happens to be an accomplished photographer. She feels that these manuals will ensure that the newcomer to the art will have an easier time than she did, in obtaining the basics.

Mrs. Alston feels that the age-old art of lace making, once on the verge of disappearing, is definitely on the upswing. And though she plays down her part in this revival, the fact that her work has given it a tremendous boost is obvious. For example, when she first joined the International Old Lacers in 1972, she was the youngest of the six North Carolina members. The state now has twenty members and it seems no coincidence that most of the new members are from communities where she has taught or given demonstrations in the art of lace making.

SOLUTION TO 411

Let u = units digit and t = tens digit. Then $10t + u$ = given number and $10u + t$ = new number. $(10t + u) + (10u + t) = 121 = 11t + 11u$, $t + u = 11$. Substituting $u + 5$ for t , we get $(u + 5) + u = 11 = 2u + 5$, $2u = 6$, $u = 3$, $t = u + 5 = 8$; given number = $10 \times 8 + 3 = 83$ Ans.
